## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of first-aid measures

### 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

### 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

#### 7.1. Precautions for safe handling

**Advice on safe handling**

Used motor oils have been shown to cause skin cancer in mice following repeated application and continuous exposure. Brief or intermittent skin contact with used motor oil is not expected to have serious effects in humans if the oil is thoroughly removed by washing with soap and water.
